Part A – List of beneficiaries who are entitled

If the person who passed away was domiciled in Singapore, and did not make a valid nomination in respect of his/her monies in his/her CPF account, we will distribute the CPF money (and any money from their estate) in line with the rules of distribution as set out in the Intestate Succession Act (Cap. 146).
